

2014 the Year of the Weir?

Could 2014 be the year that Simonton Lake residents finally get what home owners on most other lakes have enjoyed for years, a weir? That situation has actually become a distinct possibility. Recently the four regulatory agencies responsible for permitting construction of the weir met at the future job sight. After reviewing the weir construction plans, the permitting agencies made suggestions where there might be concerns. This was done so that plans would contain the best design when they were delivered to the regulatory agencies when the permits were requested. These revised plans are now in the hands of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources who, on behalf of the residents of Simonton Lake, is requesting all appropriate weir construction permits.

IDNR should receive all construction permits by November. Once those

permits are in hands the Elkhart County Surveyor, the construction bidding process can begin. Bidding should be concluded in the month of November with actual construction getting underway in December. Residents have two things working in their favor for a 2014 completion of the project. First, the weir is a fairly simple project and baring complications should take only about two weeks to complete. The second point that works in the residents' interest is a forecast for another sever winter. If this December is as cold as last year, the ground will be solidly frozen and facilitate access to the construction site.

This scenario doesn't leave much room for surprises but it looks as if lake dwellers could be looking at the final chapter of the "great weir saga." I suppose this holiday season we might all be singing; "all I want for Christmas is a brand new weir."



Wildlife in our Backyard

Connie and Jon Hart, Forest Lane, occasionally hear a coyote near their home. But now they have proof that they haven't been into the cooking sherry. This coyote was spotted just across from their house along the channel. Coyotes are not rare in northern Indiana. In September 2013 Elkhart Municipal Airport manager Andy Jones reported that at least two landing had to be aborted because of coyotes near or on the runway. Another plane just missed a covote by about 20 feet. Live traps were set but not coyotes were caught.

ot long ago Carole and I were pondering an article in the business section of the newspaper that reported the Hacienda restaurant group was going to open an Italian restaurant. Our general reaction was how do you think that will work? Of course everyone is familiar with the Hacienda franchise. You may remember their first eatery began some thirty years ago in the old mansion in front of the former Kamm Brewery in Mishawaka. It was an instant success and the company has grown to 13 popular locations. But businesses must remain relevant to increasingly fickle buyers, so the management team began researching market trends and designed a completely new,

to Hacienda, platform.

The alpha Bar Bici is located in Eddy Street Commons which is the poster child for new urban retailing. The restaurant has a bicycle themed decor with a beautiful 1970's teal Bianchi hanging on the wall. The crew members are all dressed in team shirts and the old style turned up bill bicycle hats. Many have asked

me, why bicycles? First, bicycling may be more in the Italian DNA than flashy red sports cars. Secondly, and maybe more to the point, nothing is more associated with young, hip, and urban than the bicycle. Let me tell you it works. When you walk in for the first time you get a vibe that there could be thousands of places just like this around the world.

The menu genre is Italian street food. So think of Venice, a city with roots over a thousand years old. Space is very limited, so creative food purveyors sell hand held meals out of store fronts. It is user friendly and less expensive than at sit down establishments. All meal options begin with a Tavoleta; soft, tasty, freshly baked flatbread. On this edible plate you build your sandwich, salad, or pasta creation. Once you have determined which of the three directions you wish to pursue, or create your own, you walk the team member serving you through the variety of fresh food options you want to be included in your build. Picture a slightly up market variation of Chipotle. I chose the Ricotta Chicken sandwich

at \$7.45 and Carole had the Lemon Chicken Salad for \$8.95. We both found our choices quite tasty.

As good as the food tasted, I think I may have found the drink options even more exciting. Let's begin with beer. The only beer served, in bottle or on tap, is Greenbush. Greenbush Brewery is a wildly popular micro brewery in Sawyer, Michigan. (Stay tuned for another D&D article) A second choice might be the apple/pear (white) sangria. Nothing says sitting under an umbrella gazing at the Mediterranean like sangria. Finally, in keeping with the popular Hacienda frozen drinks, you might choose a frozen peach bellini. The bellini was invented by an American bar owner who opened a business on San Marco Square in Venice in the 1920's. It is made with peach nectar and Prosecco, a sparkling Italian wine. Of course there are soft drinks available too.

While we didn't choose the desert option it may well be an excuse to return. The feature desert is gelato served Sicilian-style on a warm slightly sweetened egg bun call the Brioche con Gelato. I think I picked up a few pounds just describing it. It appeared to us that this was an extremely well thought out and executed restaurant design.



Grandaughter of the Marcus'attends Girls State



Each High School in the state of Indiana may choose one or two of their top junior girls to attend this prestigious week-long conference. During the week the girls are organized into two mock political parties, precincts are set up, elections held and then the government begins to function. The attendees are instructed by Hoosier women who are themselves involved with government and politics. This year Girls State was held at Trine University (formerly Tri-State) in Angola, Indiana. 550 girls attended. At the Honors night, Francesca was selected as one of two girls from Indiana to represent Girls Nation in Washington D.C. This all-expenses paid experience allowed Francesca to interact with girls from all 50 states and learn about how the federal government works, the constitution and how laws are made, enforced and upheld. Ecozone update

Back in 2011 we had a water quality study done on Simonton Lake. There were several recommendations on maintaining and improving our water quality. One of these recommendations was to establish an ecozone. An ecozone is an area where aquatic plants are allowed to grow. The plants become a natural filter for the water in the lake.

At this time our plan has been approved by the DNR Commissioners. However, there are a few steps in the legal process that need to be completed. Even though we held our own public meeting in the fall of 2013, the DNR must hold their own public meeting. This meeting will be on October 23 at 1:00 at the Sportsmen's Club. Anyone who has questions or concerns about the ecozone at Simonton Lake should attend this meeting.

A public notice will be placed in the Elkhart Truth by the IDNR.

Also, anyone interested in offering comments on the Simonton ecozone may do so at this time via the in-

ternet. Go to http://www.in.gov/nrc/2377.htm and scroll through the list until you see the line titled Simonton Lake Boating Zone. Then click on the area on the right that says "comment on this rule" and a separate window will open for their comment. Positive as well as negative comments are welcome.
