

CRIME REPORT

Sunday, March 28

A white Ford F150 truck was stolen from a home on Dolph Road (on the north side of Little Simonton).

Tuesday, March 30 the truck stolen from Dolph Road was found abandoned in a field in Cass County, Michigan.

Beware of Scams;

Email Hacking-Lake Association President, Carole Foutz, has had her email hacked several times in the last couple of years. The scam in these instances are requests that seem to come from Carole and sent out to Carole's contacts asking for the recipients to buy gift cards for various causes. The Lake Association never does any gift card purchasing for other organizations.

<u>Social Security and IRS</u>- Several lake residents have received calls that they owe money to the Federal Government and will be prosecuted unless they call the number left in the message. This is a scam. Other lake residents report that they have received calls saying their Social Security checks will be stopped unless a return call is made. This is also a scam.

Website Scams- At least two agencies in the area have received calls saying they would be sued unless photographs owned by the caller were removed from the agency's website or a fee was paid to the photographer. This was a scam. The creator of the websites, in both cases, used stock photos for which a fee had already been paid.

Arrests **Threatened** The Elkhart County Sheriff's Office has been receiving reports from people who have gotten alarming phone calls. The caller ID shows up as the Elkhart County Sheriff's Office phone number, but the calls are not coming from that agency. The caller says the person's social security number has been used for something illegal in Texas and the person will be arrested on a warrant unless they purchase gift cards and reveal the number on the back of the card. One caller went as far as to use Sheriff Jeff Siegel's name. These calls are NOT coming from the Elkhart County Sheriff's Office and are not to be taken seriously. Please do not fall victim to this scam. The Elkhart County Sheriff's Office will NEVER call and ask you for gift card information.

March 2021-Golf Cart Concerns-Several residents have voiced concerns about golf carts speeding and driving erratically in lake neighborhoods.

According to County Ordinance 2016-504 adopted in 2016:

A golf cart driver must have a valid current license.

Golf Carts may be operated on roadways in unincorporated areas of the county, but NOT on numbered County Roads or State Highways.

The operator of the golf cart must comply with all traffic laws, rules, and regulations only between sunrise and sunset.

While it is specifically listed in an official ordinance, we hope operators of all motorized vehicles will drive safely and respect their neighbor's property.





• **Information**-On Simonton Lake our Ecozone is marked by several of these buoys. Only trolling motors are allowed in the Ecozone. No power boats! No wave runners! No anchoring





When meeting another power boat head on, keep to the right (starboard)



When a power boat meets a sailboat the power boat is the one which must change course.

- Make sure your 2021 Boat Registration number and Excise Tax are properly displayed.
- Make sure you have enough life jackets on board.
- Be courteous to other boaters.
- Watch out for swimmers in the water



In preparing this article only the issues presented at the Elkhart Zoning Appeals Board meetings which concern land in the Simonton Lake area of Osolo Township are listed. January Meeting

• No issues presented regarding the Simonton Lake area of Osolo Township.

February Meeting

• The application for construction of an accessory structure without a residence on property located on the north side of North Shore Drive west of CR 11 was denied.

March Meeting

• The application for a 15-foot variance (Ordinance requires 50 ft.) to allow for the construction of an at tached garage 35 ft. from the centerline of the right of way on North Shore Drive north of Douglas Avenue was approved.

April 15 Meeting

• Scheduled for the April 15 meeting of the Zoning Board of Appeals: The application for a 15 ft developmental variance (Ordinance requires 50 ft.) to allow for the construction of an attached garage addition 35 ft. from the centerline of the right-of-way on the north side of Aqua Drive.



NEW DNR COMPLIANCE (PIER ISSUES, ETC.) OFFICER

Scott Dean has been appointed our new Compliance and Enforcement Officer at the Indiana DNR.

The Compliance and Enforcement Section conducts <u>on-</u> <u>site public assistance visits and</u>

investigates reported lake and stream violations. Their primary objective when they come across violations, is to educate, and work with the property owner to resolve the violation and make their issue compliant with the state's regulations.

LAKE PRESERVATION ACT CONTAINS THE STANDARDS

Compliance and Enforcement Officers enforce the rules found in the **Lake Preservation Act**. Here is an excerpt:

"Activities regulated by the Department under the Lakes Preservation Act include any project that will result in an alteration of a lake's bed or shoreline. Typically, this includes: dredging, new seawalls, seawall refacing, underwater beaches, boat wells, boat houses, and fish attractors.

The complete Lake Preservation Act can be found on the Simonton Lake website under "Resources." Scott has been with the DNR Division of Water for 13 years.

When she is not here, she resides in Rock Hill, South Carolina where she is active in the Carolina Basset Hound Rescue, a group which rescues, cares for and places basset hounds in both North and South Carolina. Holly, a 5-year-old basset hound was rescued by Carolina Basset Hound Rescue (CBHR) back in 2017. She was adopted by a wonderful family who had previously rescued a dog they named Lucy.

Lucy is a 9-year-old basset beagle mix. One of Lucy's front legs is slightly twisted in a "Ballet" pose which is why her family thought she was abandoned on the roadside.

These two sweet girls were loved and adored by their family. Lucy was a daddy's girl and loved laying in his lap. Holly was a mama's girl and enjoying laying at her feet. Then COVID came along and both "dog parents" ended

up in the hospital in early fall of 2020. Dad passed in November. Mom started to get better and was moved to rehab where she took a sudden turn for the worse and passed the week before Christmas.

The daughter of this couple tried to hold the family together including her own pets and recover from major surgery herself as well deal with losing both parents in one month. She reached out to CBHR for help just before Christmas. CBHR had heard about the illness in the family as both mom and dad were dedicated volunteers for the group. CBHR policy is "once a CBHR dog, always a CBHR dog", so Holly was assured of a new home. Once CBHR learned that these two girls were bonded, Lucy was also brought into the rescue.

Then CBHR had to find a foster home quickly for these two. A couple of the officers of the group remembered that I had lost my two bassets in the fall of 2020 and they called me to see if I would consider fostering these two girls. They were located just an hour away from me, and, after my two bassets were gone, my home was just too quiet, so I said "Yes, I'll go pick them up tomorrow!". So, Holly and Lucy came to live with me. The other officers and board members started betting on how long it would take before I applied to officially adopt these two. It took just one week.

They are both sweet and loving girls. They have charmed everyone they have met in the neighborhood. My house is again full of barking and basset "zoomies", and I am loving it.

BUOYS-Who buys them? Who maintains them?

BUYING BUOYS

The purchase of buoys for Simonton Lake is now the responsibility of the <u>Simonton Lake Conservancy</u>. Using special assessment monies, the Conservancy buys new buoys as needed. In some cases, old buoys need to be replaced. In other cases, additional buoys are needed.

The Conservancy has just purchased additional "No Wake" buoys and "Ecozone Buoys" to mark the Simonton Lake Ecozone, an area that is off limits to all motorized watercraft except trolling motors.

All buoys purchased for Simonton Lake are United States Coast Guard approved buoys.

WHERE DO WE HAVE BUOYS ON SIMONTON LAKE?

There are three areas marked by buoys on our lake:



- No Wake buoys and smaller "ice spar" buoys in the main channel.
- No Wake buoys in smaller channels.
- Ecozone buoys which mark the boundary of the Ecozone in the southeast area of Little Simonton.

Buoys on Simonton Lake have been permitted by the Indiana DNR Law Enforcement Division.

MONITORING BUOYS

The Conservancy is also responsible for the monitoring of our buoys. Which buoys are damaged and need to be replaced? Where are the problem areas that need more buoys? Are there buoys that have been illegally moved? This is where the Lake Association and individual lake residents come in. Our Safety Committee is tasked with watching over these buoys and communicating problems to the Conservancy. If you would be willing to help in this effort (Not a big job, just a little watchfulness and communication) please contact one of our leaders listed on page 3.

PUTTING BUOYS IN THE LAKE

The Conservancy Board is a group of just six people. They need our help to put in new buoys and move buoys that have been dragged out of place. Buoys must be placed in the water according to GPS coordinates. Bob Evans, long-time lake resident and volunteer, has GPS capabilities on his boat and has volunteered to head the effort. However, he needs some muscle to place the buoys.

In addition to the new buoys the Conservancy has just purchased, there are 11 small "ice spar" buoys that did not get placed last year.

If you would be willing to help, contact Bob Evans.

IT'S TICK SEASON

Excerpts from an article "Tick Season Upon Us" by Jeff Burbrink, Elkhart Truth, and Information from the CDC website

In his article on March 18 Jeff Burbrink, Purdue Extension Agent for Elkhart County, reported that ticks had been out in force for about a week stimulated by the warm weather. The predominant tick reported was a deer tick also known as a black legged tick, Lyme disease tick and bear tick. Also reported to him were the America Dog Tick and the Lone Star Tick.

VACCINES

Mr. Burbrink reported that while your dog can get an annual vaccine, there is no longer a vaccine for humans on the market. For humans, covering your arms and legs and wearing repellents is advised. After being outdoors it is a good idea to check for ticks.

American Dog Tick Adults are oval and flattened in

shape and are brown with whitish to gray markings.
As larvae, they have six legs while nymphs and adults have eight. These extremities allow them to

effectively crawl through their environment, as well as animal fur and human hair.

REMOVING A TICK

If you find a tick attached to you remove it carefully. The Center for Disease Control advises: "Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin's surface as possible. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. After removing the tick, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or soap and water. Never crush a tick with your fingers. Dispose of a live tick by putting it in alcohol, placing it in a sealed bag/container, wrapping it tightly in tape, or flushing it down the toilet."

Deer Tick or Lyme Disease Tick


Significantly smaller than the more commonly encountered dogtick, adult femaledeer ticks are about as big as a sesame seed



and have reddish hind bodies with black markings. Males are slightly smaller than females and are solid dark brown.

Lone Star Tick Adult ticks have eight legs and are brown to tan. Females have a single silverywhite spot on its back while males have scattered spots or streaks around the margins of the body.

Answer: From the Michigan Department of Natural Resources

A Google search on Lake Foam brought hits from almost every state in the union including Alaska. The best answer came from the Michigan DNR which produces a brochure.


Most **lake foam** is caused when the surface tension of water is decreased, and air is mixed into the water. Organic materials from naturally decaying plants and animals can reduce the surface tension of water, and when the wind blows across it, or waves wash against the shore, bubbles are produced.

SPRING CLEAN UP ON THE LAKE

As you take your kayaks or rowboats out on the lake this spring, we ask that you take a trash bag with you and pick up litter. Spring is a great time to do this because the water is high. If we each take some time to pick up trash the lake will be the better for it. We have reports that quite a bit of trash has floated up into the cattails in the main channel.

Here are some other ways to keep our lake clean:

- 1. Don't allow grass clippings, leaves or other lawn debris to fall into the lake.
- 2. Never blow your leaves into the lake.
- 3. Use a zero-phosphorus fertilizer.
- 4. Pick up pet waste. Never dump geese or duck droppings in the water.
- 5. When landscaping near the water, beware of possible erosion.
- 6. Big/waves cause shoreline erosion. Go slowly in NO WAKE areas.
- 7. Always take a trash bag in your boat, kayak, or canoe.
 8. If you have a septic systemmake sure it functions properly.
 9.Don't/use the lake as a bathtub. Soaps and shampoos contain nutrients and pollutants that are harmful to the lake and organisms living in it.

INDIANA WETLANDS BILL MOVES FORWARD

This winter Indiana Senate Bill 389 moved forward and looked like it might become law. We have an area of wetlands which borders Little Simonton on the southeast shoreline.

Why be concerned about this marshy area on the Little Lake?

Wetlands are vital to a healthy ecosystem and water resources. They provide water purification, groundwater recharge, and critical wildlife habitat. Wetlands act like giant sponges in the landscape absorbing 1 - 1.5 million gallons of water per acre which reduces flooding.

According to the Indiana General Assembly website this bill in its original form:

- Repealed state regulated wetlands law.
- Repealed the law requiring a permit from the IDEM for wetland activity in a state regulated wetland.
- Stated that the repeal of that law is not intended to affect:
 - (1) the regulation in Indiana under the federal Clean Water Act of the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States; or
 - (2) the authorization of the state of Indiana to administer the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit program.
- Provided that the repeal of that law extinguishes any judicial administrative proceeding concerning an alleged violation.

In short, in its original form this bill would have <u>repealed most protections for state-regulated wetlands</u> in Indiana and <u>terminated all pending legal actions</u> against persons who violated the Indiana wetlands law.

However, the bill also must go through the Indiana House. On April 7 the House Environmental Affairs Committee adopted Amendment 24, which preserves protection of most wetlands. On April 12 the bill will be eligible for more amendments on the House floor during 2nd reading.


